• Governance Structure

Last week Rob Devitt announced the plan for the Governance structure of CKHA. After months of reviewing materials, archives, best practices in the literature, meeting minutes, media articles and meeting with former boards, community organizations, key stakeholders, the structure calls for a two site, one board model. The focus will include both campuses and a board of 12 members.

• Smoke Free Campus

As of January 1st both campuses will be smoke free. This is an Ontario legislation that comes into effect for all hospitals across the province. We will be removing the gazebos and instructing staff, patients, volunteers, families to move off the property if they choose to smoke. We are working with the Municipality Bylaw Enforcement Officer as well. Our security team will be trained to ticket those who choose to smoke on CKHA property with a fine of \$175.00.
